The US Youth Games were created by former New York Mayor John Lindsay and were first held in 1967. The Youth Games are designed to be a showcase for inner-city youths' skills and to be an opportunity for these youth to test their skills against their peers from across the country. These games were conceived as a vehicle to stimulate summer programs, to aid the youth of our urban cities, and to foster a better understanding through healthy competition actively based upon the Youth Games philosophy. Its primary objective is to bring together boys and girls of different cities in friendly competition and to foster better understanding among the youth of today.
