Thunderhead Toddler Play Structure A separate toddler size climbing wall, cave and slides.




Colossal Fossils Oversized cast fossils for sitting, climbing and imagining.

Donor Recognition – A Silurian Period Reef

Just as a fossil tells a story of long ago, your contribution to the development of Hartung Park will be represented by being forever cast in bronze for generations to come.

As part of the environmental education within the park, interpretive sculpture will recreate a prehistoric Silurian Period Reef which once was the underwater landscape of this region approximately 400 million years ago. Several species which represent life as it existed during the Silurian Period will be cast in bronze and mounted on large dolomite outcroppings.

This display is intended to recreate the fossilized outcrops of the ancient Silurian Period Reef which were exposed during the quarrying. This activity gave many the opportunity to find and study the fossils which give us a glimpse into a time long before we humans walked the earth.

In recognition, your name will be listed on a sign under the fossil species representing the level of your financial contribution. Each bronze fossil representing its place within the life of the reef during the Silurian Period, will also boldly represent your contribution in the creation of a place for children to play, explore, learn ...and someday be inspired to contribute to society just as you have.

Donor Recognition Categories – Fossils of a Silurian Period Reef



Brachiopods \$100-249

Symmetrical, clam-like, solitary organisms, these fossils are very common in Silurian bedrock of SE, WI.



Crinoids \$250-499

These flower-like organisms are suspension feeders. They were very abundant and important reef builders in the Silurian Period.



Trilobites \$500-999 (WI State Fossil)

The first of its kind to swim about the reef. Trilobites are commonly found in the Silurian bedrock of SE, WI and ranked the Official State Fossil of Wisconsin.



Corals \$1,000-4,999

Solitary or colonial corals were very important Silurian reef builders. Fossils are common, the orders Rugosa and Tabulata are important for Paleozoic age determination.



Nautiloid Cephalopods \$5,000-9,999

Squid-like, this solitary organism was a swimming predator of the reef. It's a straight shelled relative of the well know spiraled shelled Nautilus.



Eurypterids \$10,000+

Giant scorpion-like solitary organisms, these swimming predators occasionally visited the reef.
