Resolution relative to application, acceptance, and funding of a grant application to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for workforce development and job training at the Century City project in the City of Milwaukee.

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority of the City of Milwaukee is eligible for grant funds from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for workforce development and job training in the city; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority recognizes that remediation of the Century City project area is a critical component of the overall success of the redevelopment; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority will partner with WRTP/BIG STEP in training and certifying neighborhood job seekers for careers in environmental remediation; and

Whereas, the training and certifying will include environmental remediation programs such as HAZWOPER 40-hour, Asbestos Worker, Asbestos Worker-Exterior, Lead Safe Renovator, Leaking Underground Storage Tank training, Stormwater Management and Operation, and Lifesaver-Rail Safety/Emergency Responder; and

Whereas, the workforce development and job training program anticipates recruiting 40 individuals, enrolling 20 individuals, and anticipates graduating 16; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority will maintain records documenting all expenditures made during the grant period; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority of the City of Milwaukee has determined that operation of this job training program would cost approximately \$387,520, of which \$287,520 would be provided by the Grantor; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority share of this job training program, \$100,000, will come from the Century City budget, but more specifically, the Community Development Block Grant Administration allocated funds to the Century City project for workforce training; and

Whereas, the benefits to the Redevelopment Authority from this Grant program appear to exceed the Redevelopment Authority's share of costs and other obligations to be incurred under this program; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Redevelopment Authority of the City of Milwaukee that application, implementation and acceptance of said Grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency by the Assistant Executive Director under the terms specified above, is authorized; and be it

Further Resolved, that the proper officers of the Redevelopment Authority be and hereby are authorized and directed to enter into an agreement and/or other documents deemed necessary and agreed to by the Assistant Executive Director in order to execute the grant program.
