Resolution relative to application, acceptance, and funding of a United States Environmental Protection Agency Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Program grant for a redevelopment plan for the Inner Harbor area in the City of Milwaukee.

Whereas, The City of Milwaukee Sustainability Plan, ReFresh MKE, adopted by the Common Council on December 17, 2013, identifies the Inner Harbor as a Catalytic Project; and

Whereas, In the Sustainability Plan, the City of Milwaukee has identified the Inner Harbor as a prime target for redevelopment full of economic potential, untapped ecological resilience, and inherent to a working waterfront with a potential to reach the goal of remediating 100 acres of brownfields by 2023; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority is eligible for grant funds from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to conduct research, technical assistance, and/or training activities that will enable the Redevelopment Authority to develop and area-wide plan for brownfields assessment, cleanup, and subsequent reuse; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority recognizes that grant eligible activities including facilitating community involvement, conducting research into the existing conditions of the brownfield sites and project area, developing a detailed brownfield area-wide plan, and obtaining technical assistance that builds the local community will be critical steps in the redevelopment of the Inner Harbor; and

Whereas, the Redevelopment Authority will maintain records documenting all expenditures made during the grant period; and

Whereas, the operation of this Grant program from October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2017 would cost up to \$200,000, of which \$200,000 or 100% percent would be provided by the Grantor; and


Whereas, the benefits to the City from this Grant program appear to exceed the Authority's share of costs and other obligations to be incurred under this program; now, therefore, be it
