Domestic Violence Services and Resources

The Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office

The DA's office operates a specialized domestic violence unit to charge and prosecute misdemeanor and felony domestic violence offenses. In addition to prosecutors, the DV Unit consists of six Victim Witness Specialists assigned to the three Domestic Violence Courts. Specialists are responsible for keeping victims and witnesses informed of all domestic violence misdemeanor and felony case proceedings. They attend court on a daily basis and answer any questions and concerns victims and witnesses may have and make support service referrals for crime victims.
