### Message from County Executive Walker

This morning, the County Board's Personnel Committee passed a motion (4 - 2) calling for the county to draft changes to include domestic partner benefits. The change would cost the county some \$3.9 million per year.

Earlier this week, the members of the Finance Committee voted to remove \$1.7 million worth of savings to the taxpayers from two initiatives to contract out services for housekeeping and security.

Do they not realize how much people are hurting? Do they not see the 31% increase in bankruptcy filings? Do they not see the record number of foreclosures? Do they not see the employers moving jobs out of the area and state?

We can't afford these changes that add millions in additional costs to the local taxpayers. If you share these concerns, please contact your County Board Supervisor at 278-4222.




# Walker named MPA Elected Official of the Year
