SUPERVISOR COGGS-JONES HONORS #1 STUNNAS MOTORSPORTS TEAM AT MILWAUKEE COUNTY BOARD MEETING

**32 members, four founders of the #1 Stunnas presented
with citations from County Board**

Milwaukee, WI – Milwaukee County Supervisor Elizabeth Coggs-Jones presented citations to members of the #1 Stunnas motorsports team at Thursday’s Milwaukee County Board meeting.

“I’m proud to recognize these volunteers for all their help to better the lives of Milwaukee County residents,” Supervisor Coggs-Jones said. “From their help with the annual Back-to-School program to providing security and other support for the Spring Bling Parties I organized earlier this year, the #1 Stunnas have demonstrated their commitment to civic duty by working with young kids to help them realize their dreams. They have also helped in many programs to help the less fortunate.”

Even this week, the #1 Stunnas are helping the family of Jasmine Owens, the four-year-old girl tragically shot earlier this week in Milwaukee. The #1 Stunnas also raised money for the search of Purvis Virginia-Parker and Quadrevion Henning in 2006.
