Budget Season Commences

On September 30, the County Executive presented his proposed 2011 budget, available <u>here</u>. As a member of the Committee on Finance and Audit, I will offer input so that Milwaukee County continues to provide essential services and maintain parks, transit and paramedic services. Each year, the State reduces its support for mandated programs. As a result, non-mandated services suffer cuts.

These are exceptionally difficult times, and I seek creative solutions to run our County effectively. I anticipate a challenging budget process as we try to construct a responsible budget to meet the needs of our residents.

The County Board will hold a public hearing on the budget on Monday, November 1, 2010, at 7 p.m. at the Washington Park Senior Center (4420 W. Vliet Street, Milwaukee).

Fiscal Matters and My Office Account

I have run my office in a fiscally responsible manner. My monthly E-Newsletter enables me to communicate directly and cost-effectively with you. Most of my summer print newsletters were delivered as part of a neighborhood mailer, saving taxpayer dollars on postage and printing. Every year that I have been in office, I have returned money from my interoffice account after requiring that my office be very prudent with costs. Since I voted to require our non-represented employees to take 12 furlough days, I decided to participate as well. I will have returned the equivalent of 12 days pay to the county treasurer by year's end.

County Board Reduces Pension for Elected Officials

The County Board voted to reduce the pensions of County elected officials by lowering the multiplier from 2 to 1.6%, bringing the pensions in line with employees who are not represented or who belong to the three unions that took the reduction.

Repairing the Hoan Bridge

A contractor has been hanging netting under the Hoan Bridge. Deck repair will begin in October, with preparation work including concrete masonry deck patching being performed by Lunda Construction. The southern portion of the bridge will be addressed first. Westbound Carferry ramps (which



carry traffic north initially) will be closed so the ramps can be resurfaced. WisDOT has directed that two lanes of westbound traffic (traveling north on the Hoan) remain open during the project. WisDOT anticipates completion of deck repair in 2011.

I look forward to the completion of engineering studies by the end of 2010, which will make it possible to budget for the desperately needed re-decking of the bridge.

Milwaukee's Gateway Aerotropolis

The County Board voted 14 to 4 in support of Milwaukee's Gateway Aerotropolis collaborative planning efforts. I co-sponsored this resolution because General Mitchell International Airport has been a great engine for regional job growth and, with the proper planning and cooperation, can contribute to even more economic development. The Milwaukee Gateway Aerotropolis is an excellent way to coordinate regional economic efforts and promote a strong economy in the South Shore.

An Aerotropolis requires coordination of airport-centered commerce, real estate development and various transportation options. The Cities of St. Francis, Cudahy, South Milwaukee and Oak Creek have participated in the Airport Area Economic Development Task Force which, for two years, has brought together municipalities along with business and tourism groups from the Airport region and other agencies. These representatives have consulted with planning staff to review and coordinate land use and area plans for the Airport region. As a result of this success, the participants founded Milwaukee's Gateway Aerotropolis, a non-profit organization that will coordinate planning among governments. All eight cities involved have voted to support this proposal. The Milwaukee Gateway Aerotropolis will be controlled by its member governments and include representatives of local business associations. The Aerotropolis will not change the ownership or legal oversight of our airport. Milwaukee County will continue to oversee Airport operations under this resolution.

Fixx Too Coffee Kiosk Now Open at Warnimont Park

Fixx Coffee House of St. Francis has opened Fixx Too, a kiosk at the entrance to Warnimont Dog Exercise Area. Park users can now purchase coffee, smoothies and other drinks while enjoying the wooded trails and letting their dogs burn off some energy. The dog park has been wildly successful! The parks department has sold many new dog park permits. Constituents continually contact our office indicating their pleasure in using the new dog park. All of this good news, and the dog park has yet to completely open since new grass has been protected with temporary fences.

If you have not seen the new dog exercise area, please give it a try in the near future for a pleasant surprise! Visitors may park in the southern parking lot of Kelly Senior Center (6100 S. Lake Dr., Cudahy) to access this area on the southern edge of Warnimont Park. If you wish to take a dog, annual permits are \$25 for Milwaukee County residents, but Parks is offering a bargain \$15 permit for use through the end of the year. Seniors and people with disabilities pay \$15 for annual permits. Additional dogs are \$5. A daily permit is \$5. The Public Policy Forum along with its consultants will present a report concerning mental health in Milwaukee County before the Long Range Strategic Plan Steering Committee on Wednesday, October 6, at 9:30 a.m. The report will document ways to improve mental health care and treatment by redesigning public and private delivery of services.

Lakeside Bridge at Grant Park's Seven Bridges Trail

The Parks Department has fixed the lakeside bridge. However, quotes to reinstall the repaired bridge came in at over \$100,000. The proposals involved installation with a helicopter lift or a barge and truck.

The Parks Department continues to explore alternatives because Milwaukee County does not have \$100,000 in the budget for this installation. I hope we restore the bridge soon, but with the deficits that the County faces, it will be difficult to find the funds.

South Milwaukee Goes Pink

South Milwaukee is going pink on October 19 for breast cancer awareness month. Mayor Tom Zepecki has declared Tuesday, October 19, as a citywide day to support the fight against breast cancer.
