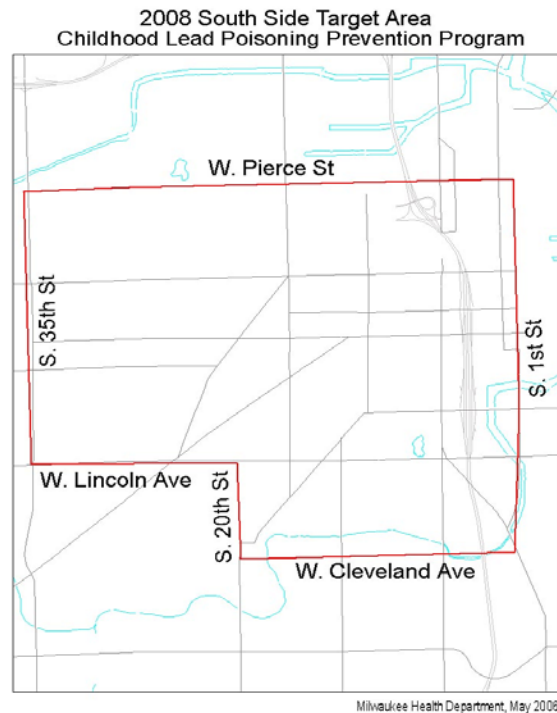
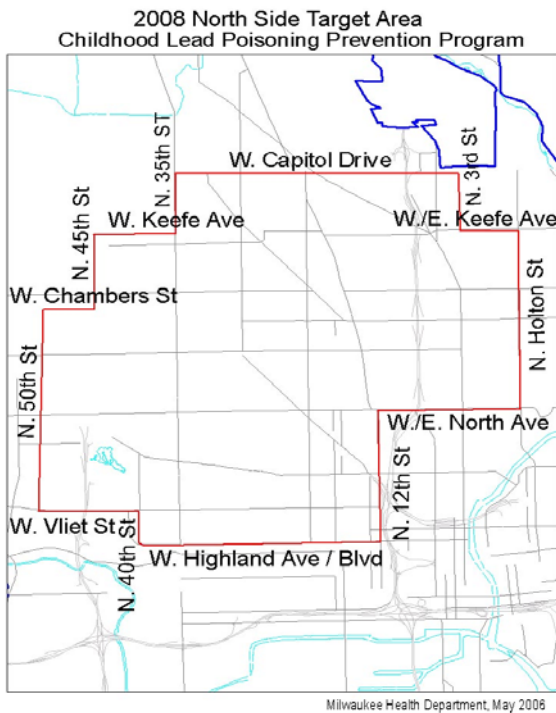


2009 Primary Prevention Supplemental Funding Eligibility Requirements



Supplemental funding is available for window lead abatement. Window lead abatement includes either a jamb liner treatment or complete window replacement. The City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) will provide \$185.00 per jamb liner treatment. If the owner chooses to replace their windows, the MHD will pay \$185.00 per window towards the cost of replacement; **the owner will pay the remainder of the installation cost to the contractor as well as paying for a \$57 lead abatement permit.** To obtain supplemental funding, the property owner must choose a contractor from the MHD Certified Lead Abatement Contractor List to conduct the window lead abatement work at the enrolled property. Property owners must also address all additional identified lead hazards in their properties, which are to be paid for by the property owner within 60 days of signing a contract with a certified lead abatement contractor or attending an approved 8 hour EPA certified training class.

All of the following eligibility requirements must be met. If these requirements are not met or complied with, you may be disqualified from obtaining supplemental funding. If you are eligible and interested in participating in the primary prevention program, please complete the accompanying application and mail it to the address indicated on the application. Eligibility Requirements:

- Owner occupants must have children present who are less than 36 months of age and agree to blood lead tests for all children less than 72 months of age. (Visiting children must spend at least 6 hours per week at the property.)
- Property must be located within the above target areas.
- Property must be built prior to 1950.
- Property taxes must be current on all property holdings.
- Building Inspection orders must be correct on property being enrolled.
- Property must be assessed at less than \$150,000.
- Rental units must be available to low-income residents three years after completion of lead hazard control.
- Owner occupants must be considered low income.
- Windows must have lead hazards documented by MHD staff.
- All windows must have storms (unless replacement windows are to be installed).
- In-home childcare centers must receive parental consent to blood lead test all children less than 72 months of age.
- All identified lead hazards must be addressed prior to completing lead hazard abatement on the property's windows.
- Property owners that choose to address additional identified lead hazards through interim controls themselves must attend an 8-hour EPA certified training class prior to addressing those hazards.
