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SJC Overview



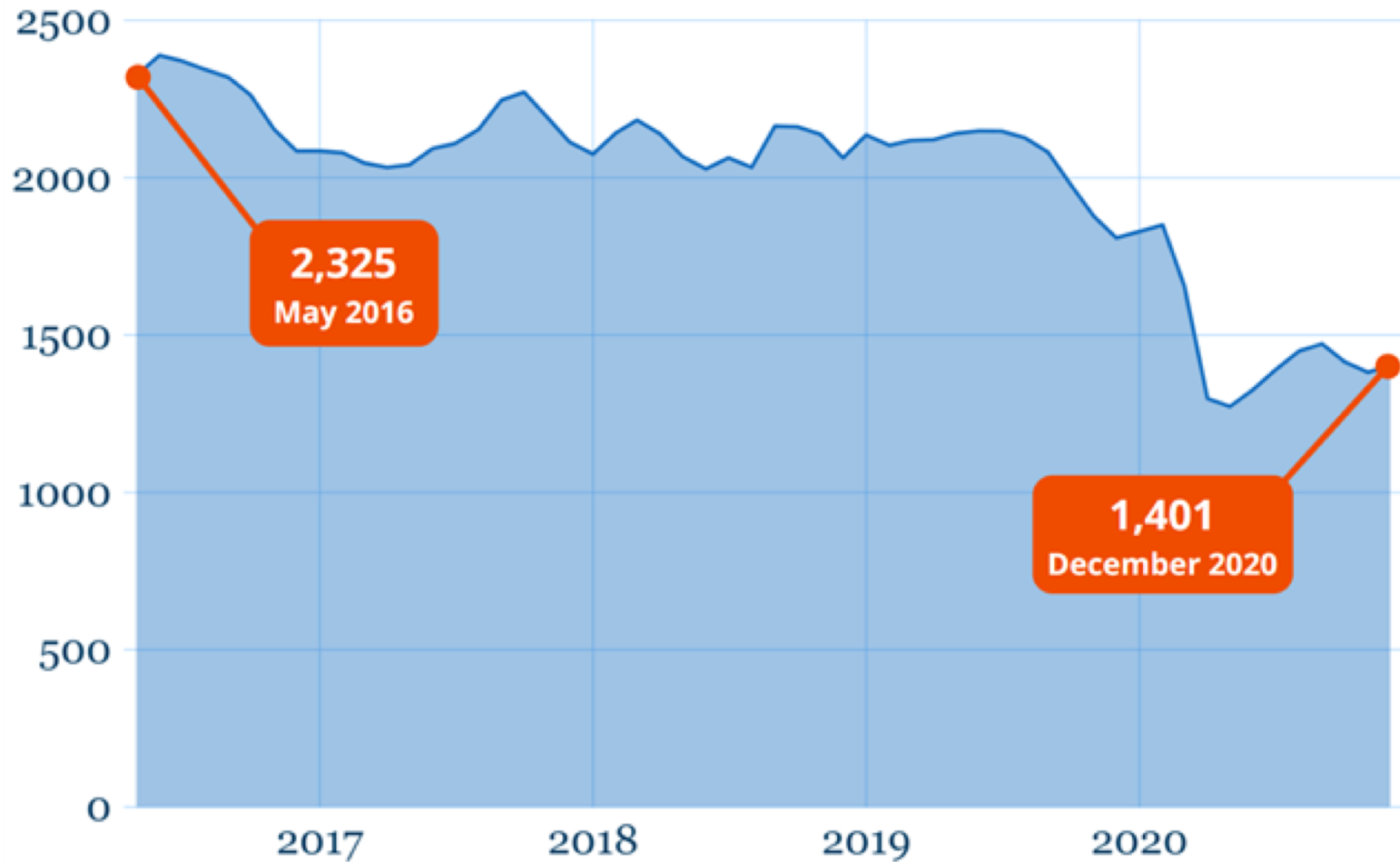
- **Goals**

- Decrease unnecessary use of local jails
- Reduce racial and ethnic disparities in the justice system

SJC Phases

- **Phase 1 (2015):** Planning and development of site-specific strategies
- **Phase 2 (2016 - 2018):** Funding and TA to implement strategies
- **Phase 3 (2019 - 2020):** Continued support to implement strategies
- **Phase 4 (2021 - 2022):** Focus on long-term sustainability and racial equity

Case Processing

Increase efficiency & streamline case movement through justice system

- Support EI & DV DPA Programs
- Fund treatment programming
- Continue Court Reminder Program
- Maintain Jail Population Review Team

Expanded Data

Monitor trends, track progress, and inform policy with accurate data

- Conduct SJC cost-benefit analysis
- Research COVID & public safety
- Collect data on trends: COVID, key drivers of incarceration, disparities

Mental Health Diversion

Identify people with mental health needs and link them to community resources

- Staff Mental Health Diversion process
- Streamline forensic discharge process

Racial Equity

Convene system and community partners to measurably reduce disparities

- Hire Racial Equity Coordinator
- Decision point analyses with system and community partners
- Develop CJC strategic plan with racial equity lens
- Relaunch 6-part criminal justice learning series
