Pilot Extended Courthouse Operations into the Evening Hours	One Year	Covers required overtime expenditures - for the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office and Clerk of Courts - to pilot two evening courts, twice per week.	\$119,000
Formalize Mental Health Treatment Court	Two Years	Funds the hiring of a Treatment Court Coordinator to lead the planning and formalization of a mental health treatment court. Funds are also allocated to create a psychiatry fellowship partnership.	\$265,000
Enhance Employment and Vocational Preparedness Programs at the Milwaukee County House of Correction	One Year	The Milwaukee County House of Correction will partner with Employ Milwaukee to provide pre-employment, cognitive behavioral therapy, and connections to post-employment resources using a trauma informed care approach. Providing for additional reentry services, particularly industry-recognized training, to begin while participants are still incarcerated and to continue post-release, can help HOC eliminate the time gap between release and enrolling into reentry programming and/or immediate employment for inmates. Inmates that do not recidivate will not return to HOC, reducing operational costs.	\$612,000
