MEETING TOPICS

The bail decision is one of the most critical decision points in the criminal justice system. The decision to release or detain a defendant pretrial has significant consequences for both the defendant and the criminal justice system. With the implementation of Universal Screening in January of 2012, Milwaukee County transformed this critical decision point from one that was often charge based and lacking in pertinent defendant information to a system in which every defendant's risk for pretrial misconduct is assessed utilizing a validated pretrial risk assessment instrument. Accompanying this change was the re-design of the County's pretrial supervision programs. The transformation and re-design are grounded in evidence-based best practices and research on what works in achieving the best possible pretrial outcomes. The County recently completed mini-validation of the pretrial risk assessment instrument and praxis. So how is the system working and what are the outcomes?

Chief Judge Jeffrey Kremers and Judicial Review Coordinator, Holly Szablewski will provide outcome data on Milwaukee County's Universal Screening and Pretrial Supervision programs.
