The minutes from the July 16th meeting were approved by the committee.

- III. Dept. of Aging Presentation (Ramona Williams)

Ramona Williams provided a brief overview of the Milwaukee County Department of Aging and elder abuse. She then provided a detailed explanation of an anticipated U.S Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women grant that the Department of Aging will be applying for. The grant RFP is expected to be released at around the end of the year. The up to \$400,000 grant is designed to foster collaboration in the community for the purpose of fighting elder abuse. The District Attorney's office has already agreed to participate in the grant, and the Department of Aging is optimistic about the participation of other critical system partners. The committee agreed to vote on a letter of support from the CJC to assist with the grant application at a future committee meeting.

- IV. Data Scorecard Presentation (Mallory O'Brien)

Mallory O'Brien led a powerpoint presentation of system data that included information from the Milwaukee Police Department, the Milwaukee municipal court, juvenile court, the District Attorney's Office, Pretrial Services, the Courts, the Sheriff's Office, the House of Correction, and the Department of Corrections. Representatives of many of those systems presented on their portion of the presentation and provided commentary. The presentation is included as an attachment.

- V. Human Trafficking Task Force (Dana World-Patterson, Human Trafficking Task Force of Greater Milwaukee Chair)

Dana World-Patterson gave remarks on the recently launched “Unlucky 13” initiative that is designed to reduce human trafficking in the Milwaukee area. For more information, visit <http://unluckythirteen.org/>.
