



**Jail & Huber Utilization Committee Minutes:**

Monday, July 18th, 2016 – 8:00am

- i.) **MacArthur Foundation Safety and Justice Challenge** – Tom provided a recap of the SJC strategies and noted that this committee will be an essential component of the Heavy Utilizer Strategy. The Heavy Utilizer Strategy will take a deeper look into those individuals who are cycling through the jail and using an extraordinary amount of jail bed days. This list is still in the process of being developed and refined, but this group will be kept abreast of updates. The group provided feedback regarding the imperative need to incorporate case management, peer support and qualified payees are essential for successfully keeping heavy utilizers from cycling in and out of the jail.

The group provided feedback around next steps. Mandy and Tom acknowledge we are in need of assistance around HIPAA and data sharing of protected health information. Dr. White noted that community case management, peer support and an active payee is essential for community success.

- ii.) **Forensic Treatment Update** – Adam Oldenburg (WCS) was unable to attend today, but provided Mandy Potapenko with an email update of the current waitlist. Adam also noted that Mendota is on track to open 14 additional beds in August of 2016.
- iii.) **Municipal Commitments** – Mandy will work to connect with MFD to also tie this to the Heavy Utilizer strategy.
- iv.) **Jail/HOC/MSDF Trend and Population Updates** - Michael Hafemann noted the House of Correction population is up to 1400, which is around 100 inmates higher than this time last year. Both Mike and Scott Sobeck noted the pretrial population is up, which is causing the HOC increase. Scott noted the relationship with the HOC remains strong and efficient. Dr. White notes there are more individuals entering the jail who are acutely mentally ill, and the Armor staff is doing their best to connect with BHD, when appropriate. Ron Malone noted DAI is full.
